Favourite animals included; the butterflies, tigers and flamingos. The children followed up this trip with some super writing and drawings about the animals at the zoo.

Since returning to school last week, we have started a new topic 'Around the World'. This topic was chosen by the children a few weeks ago, when they decided they would like to find out about life in other countries. We have started on a grand scale by finding out about what our planet is like through the text 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers. We will be learning about several countries in our topic including; England, India and Australia.

We welcomed two sets of visitors from Edge Hill University into our classroom. Early in February, we learned all about the Chinese New Year from the Confucius Institute at Edge Hill University, They shared the story of the new year with us, told us all about the Year of the Tiger and showed us how to make puppet dragons using card and straws so we could complete a dragon dance. Later in February, a second set of Edge Hill University visitors shared with us a book about dreams and aspirations and helped us to think about our dreams and what we could do now to work towards our dreams.

We also had the most fantastic day at the zoo, meeting the animals and learning all about their needs and it was certainly an amazing day for those of us who dream of working with animals.


February also saw us bid farewell to Miss Kenny, who has been working with us since November. During our final day together, we all had an amazing STEM day learning lots about science and maths.

This half term, we will be working with Ms Jones to produce a piece of music from the Baroque era as part of our new history topic: 'Musical History'. We have thoroughly enjoyed learning and listening to music through the different eras and comparing the type sof music. We have also started our singing lessons with Ms Jones and have been specifically looking at romantic music. We have enjoyed listening to the music and reflecting on what it reminds us of.

In year 4, we have started our new English topic and have been reading the novel 'Leon and the Place Between.' The book has inspired our imagination and we are really enjoying the magical mystery within the book. Over the next few weeks, we will be writing our own version of this story.

Year 5

In Year 5, we have had a super February which included a trip to Chester Zoo! Prior to half term, we completed our topic unit on volcanoes and, in English, created and edited some super explanation texts on how and why volcanoes erupt. We have started this half term with great effort and determination, revisiting place value in maths, learning all about biographies in English and having a go writing one ourselves and starting our new half-term topic of 'Music Through the Ages'. We are learning a new sport (tag rugby) which will teach and enhance lots of different skills in PE. In RE, we will learn about miracles, what miracles Jesus performed and what the word 'miracle' means to us as we run up to the

Easter holiday.
